The image received Papal recognition on April 18,1965 by Pope Paul VI. The feast is celebrated the third Sunday of January. The image is venerated as miraculous by many Filipino Catholics.

The Authority of Jesus' Word

When my children were small, I had the power all mothers have to soothe little cuts, scrapes, and bruises with a single kiss. Mother kisses, and the hurt is lessened or disappears altogether.

It worked wonders until the day my daughter burned her hand when she touched a steam pot. With full confidence, she lifted her fingers to be kissed—and then realized they still hurt. Over and over she lifted them to my lips, and over and over I kissed them until I finally admitted we needed to try something else. Cold water and a washcloth eventually soothed the pain, and the limits of my magic touch were suddenly apparent.

Jesus' power is of a different magnitude. It's evident when he reads and preaches with authority (from the Greek word exousia, which means "out of himself"—as opposed to studying or having a title thrust on him). It's even more manifest when he simply rebukes a demon and the demon leaves his human host—not because he wants to, but because he knows true authority when he sees and hears it.

It's no wonder the people are astonished. They've never seen this kind of immediate response. This is no mother's kiss to heal the little hurts of life, no magician pretending to have power he doesn't. This is the Son of God come to cast out evil itself and open the Scriptures so the people can hear God's word in a new and powerful way.

Today, let us turn to him to heal our wounds and make us whole.

YOUTH REFLECTION

"Cleansing the Unclean Spirit"

This Week...

Moses speaks of another prophet that God will raise up, and Paul speaks of being completely dedicated to the service of God. Then Jesus comes along, and people are amazed at his words and deeds. His first act of power in Mark's Gospel is to make clean the people with unclean spirits.

For Your Reflection

Jesus is teaching in the synagogue, and people are impressed with his sense of authority. Jesus is "real." He isn't preachy or arrogant or standoffish or "churchy." He speaks at their level, he makes sense, he believes in what he is saying, and he doesn't want to play games with prestige or status.

- Do you know any teachers at school who have that gift?
- Do you know any leaders in your community or your church who are like that?
- Describe an adult you can relate to, one who is "real."

Jesus cleaned the unclean. He recognized the unclean, he knew what clean and unclean were all about, and he took action and made a difference.

- Anytime we clean anything, we take those same steps. We have to recognized the need to clean, we have to know what clean looks like, and we have to take action so that the unclean becomes clean. What is something you have cleaned that took quite a bit of work?
- Anytime we have a personal problem we need to clean up, or a bad habit we need to cure, we take the same basic cleaning steps. What personal cleaning have you done for yourself? What prompted you to act?
- Sometimes personal cleaning comes as a surprise. It can happen when something difficult challenges us or something sad moves us or something awesome inspires us. Has that ever happened to you?

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA) is an incredible journey of discovery, the discovery of God's love in Jesus. If you or someone you know is interested in exploring the friendship and saving grace of Jesus Christ, we invite you to join us in the RCIA journey. It is a warm, welcoming experience that introduces the Christian faith in our Roman Catholic tradition. We explore topics such as Holy Scripture, the Sacraments, Church history and the core beliefs of the Church. Anyone who has taken this "leap of faith" has found it to be a life-altering experience.

The RCIA process is intended for those who are non-baptized. There are several rites and stages that are part of the process to prepare adults for Baptism and to receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

Rite of Reception of Baptized Christians into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church. If you have been baptized in another Christian tradition, the Catholic Church respects that baptism. Baptism is the sacrament of our rebirth in Christ and our immersion into His saving death and Resurrection. It can never be repeated. Reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church happens after a period of preparation through catechesis, prayer and worship, and an introduction to Catholic life, values, and mission.



Adults who have been baptized in the Catholic Church but have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation can prepare for reception of this sacrament through a period of catechesis and prayer.
